Task Force on Family Violence and Sojourner Truth House Merge

Merger created the largest domestic violence service provider in the state

Earlier this year, we brought together two programmatically strong and financially stable organizations, Sojourner Truth House and the Task Force on Family Violence. We took this action to better serve individuals and families impacted by domestic abuse. We are now the largest provider of domestic violence services in the state, and we are on track to serve 30,000 people this year with services that include emergency shelter, legal advocacy, child witness to violence programs, and group counseling for batterers.

Our goal is to provide a continuum of care and support that makes it easier for people who have been hurt by family violence to find safety, healing, and the skills and support they need to live a life free from domestic abuse.

The 2009 budget for Sojourner Family Peace Center is \$4 million, and we must raise \$1.9 million of that in private contributions. With domestic violence sharply increasing in Milwaukee this year, we are glad to have such a committed and determined network of supporters and partners to help us in our mission to create a more peaceful community.

Sojourner Family Peace Center Offers a Wide Array of Services to Break the Cycle of Family Violence

The merger of Sojourner Truth House and Task Force on Family Violence created the largest domestic violence agency in the state of Wisconsin. We continue to provide outstanding, efficient and convenient programming to survivors of domestic violence, children and families in our community.

These programs, which collectively will touch the lives of over 30,000 individuals each year include:

- Emergency Crisis Shelter
- Courthouse Advocacy & Restraining Order Clinic
- Legal Emergency Assistance
- 24-Hour Domestic Violence Hotline
- Domestic Abuse Victim Advocates in the Milwaukee County District Attorney's Office
- Children's Advocacy
- Ending Violence through Education
- BA—Beyond Abuse, for men and women seeking alternatives to abusive behavior
- Community Education and Prevention

Here is a description of all the programs of Sojourner Family Peace Center:

COMMUNITY EDUCATION AND PREVENTION

Community Education and Prevention serves as a pro-active outreach effort that reaches out to professionals, students, members of the interfaith community and individuals throughout our community. In these sessions, we teach that domestic violence is not to be expected or tolerated, and we identify available community resources that can be utilized to address domestic violence in our community.

SYSTEMS BASED ADVOCACY PROGRAMMING

Legal advocacy for victims of domestic violence has been proven to be one of the most effective and essential tools to end the violence in their lives. Failure to address this need can contribute to the abusers' power to keep victims dependent on them and trapped in the relationship.

Courthouse Advocacy Program provides support, advocacy and referral services for the safety and protection of adult and child victims who seek civil protection in the form of temporary restraining orders and permanent injunctions. Advocates assist clients with safety planning and navigating through the complexities of the legal system with the ultimate goal of helping the victim create a plan for ensuring safety, whether his or her decision is to leave or remain in the relationship. The program served 5,410 clients in 2008.

Community Domestic Abuse Advocacy Program provides neighborhood-level support, advocacy and referral services in partnership with the Milwaukee Police Department and the Milwaukee County District Attorney's office. This program operates in 3 out of the 7 police districts in Milwaukee. This program served 1,764 victims in 2008.

Domestic Abuse Victim Advocate Program offers support, advocacy and referral services to victims of domestic violence who appear in the Milwaukee County District Attorney office regarding the criminal review of their abuser's actions. The program served 3,503 clients in 2008.

SHELTER, CASE MANAGEMENT AND CHILDREN'S PROGRAMMING

Legal Emergency Assistance Program provides assistance in finding safe shelter and/or housing, emergency food, child care and legal services to more than 800 victims annually. Victims may also need specialized restraining order assistance, such as having an advocate meet them somewhere other than the courthouse or arrange for a private process server to serve the restraining order to an abuser who has successfully avoided the Sheriff's Department. Legal assistance is provided in partnership with Legal Action of Wisconsin.

Emergency 42-bed, wheelchair accessible, domestic violence shelter that housed 278 women and their 191 children in 2008. The shelter provides a safe and secure environment and a respite from the violence victims are suffering. Program services are offered in a case management approach, including a Job Readiness Training, parenting education, nutrition classes and support groups.

24-Hour Domestic Violence Hotline responded to 8,654 calls from law enforcement officers in 2008 who were investigating domestic violence incidents, 2,767 calls from victims in crisis, 2,083 information and referral calls, and 3,082 calls from the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Department warning of the imminent release of individuals taken into custody during domestic violence incidents.

Child Witness to Domestic Violence & Children's Advocacy provides specialized case management and legal assistance services to protective parents whose children have been victims of physical or sexual abuse or who were exposed to violence. The goal of this program is to protect children from further maltreatment and to advocate within the systems working with children affected by violence. Developmentally appropriate programming is offered in the form of support groups, academic enrichment and homework/tutoring help.

Safe Mom/Safe Baby is a collaboration with Aurora Health Care that provides services to women who are currently pregnant or have recently had a baby and are experiencing intimate partner violence. SFPC advocates offer connections needed to resources such as housing, shelter, emergency assistance, legal services support and education about intimate partner violence and safety planning.

Ending Violence Through Education provides gender-specific education and support to women with a history of sexual and/or physical abuse. Specific course offerings include: support groups for survivors (offered in Spanish, English, and Russian); Parenting After the Violence Ends (PAVE) classes for non-offending parents (offered in conjunction with the Child Witness to Domestic Violence Project); family-strengthening and violence prevention classes offered in partnership with the Wisconsin Humane Society. A Life Skills program component provides group sessions and one-on-one coaching to victims regarding financial literacy, employment, education, health and wellness, and civic engagement, such as voting, Lobby Day, etc.

BATTERERS INTERVENTION

Beyond Abuse Program provides intervention and education to batterers in a 23-week group session that helps them identify their own behavior and how it affects others. Currently, sixteen groups are offered for men and women. Groups are offered in Spanish as well. This program served 377 clients in 2008.
