Who Was Sojourner Truth?

Our emergency domestic violence shelter for women and children, Sojourner Truth House, is a tribute to “Belle” a woman born into slavery in 1797. In 1843 she walked onto the pages of history when she became Sojourner—God’s pilgrim. A second name—Truth—came to her “in a voice as true as God’s is true.” Sojourner Truth traveled widely speaking about slavery and women’s rights and working to preserve the dignity of all people.



Responding to Teen Dating Violence Requires Advocacy

Teen dating abuse is depressingly common. The National Crime Victims Survey documents that teens and young women have the highest rates of abuse. It has also been found in a national survey that a third of teens report experiencing abuse in dating. Notwithstanding this survey, released in 2000 by the U.S. Justice Department, many states still fail to cover teens in their domestic abuse laws, including providing access to protective orders.

Some actually decriminalize teen abusive behavior, in effect. Both Oregon and Nevada forbid protective orders against abusers who are younger than 18 years. A minority of states don’t recognize dating relationships at all in granting protective orders. These include Maryland, Oregon, and New York as well as Southern and rural states that are regularly behind when it comes to domestic violence legal reforms. A dozen states do not explicitly provide for teen access to protective orders, often resulting in no access at all in many courts.

Most states allow for teen orders but require parents or guardians to accompany teens applying for orders. The problem is many parents and guardians are clueless when it comes to teen abuse, failing to see it or recognizing it if observed. That’s according to a survey sponsored by Liz Claiborne, Inc., which can be accessed at its web site (www.loveisnotabuse.com).

If orders are violated by minors in states that allow them, because they are juveniles, the punishments are less than that allowed for adult violators. While there has been study of the effectiveness of sanctions against adult abusers, there

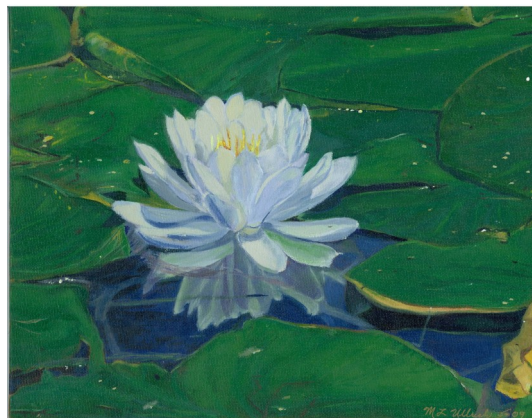

has been little to no help to deal with juvenile abusers.

There are some bright spots. In San Jose, California, there is a pioneering specialized juvenile domestic violence court specifically designed to address dating violence among other abuse-related issues involving children and teens. Young order violators are regularly arrested and confined in juvenile detention facilities and are ordered to complete specially-tailored batterer programs. The court boasts specialized probation officers trained in dealing with juvenile abusers and their victims.

Although not dealing with young abusers, a study of specialized supervision programs for adult abusers in Rhode Island funded by the National Institute of Justice suggests such specialized supervision programs that also reach out to victims are effective in reducing re-abuse, at least among lower-risk abusers. Let's hope most young abusers fall within this category.

While dating abuse may be transitory, the effects are often long lasting for its victims. As noted in the *Journal of the American Medical Association*, teen dating violence is associated with all sorts of problems later in life, including drug abuse, smoking, weight problems (in both directions), other risky behaviors, including unprotected sex, and suicide.

Cyber-stalking and Net abuse may also make things worse for younger victims, providing techno-savvy abusers with tools unimagined when most domestic violence laws were conceived and drafted by legislators.

Advocates have their work cut out for them to bring the benefits of legal and practical reforms made in the area of adult domestic violence home to our children.

In 2009, Sojourner Family Peace Center's Restraining Order Clinic assisted with a total of 227 Juvenile Harassment Restraining Orders. Juvenile Harassment restraining orders are designed to protect a juvenile who has experienced physical abuse, threats of physical violence, sexual abuse, stalking or harassment. If the final Juvenile Harassment restraining order is granted, it can remain in place for four years. This order may be the best option for many of our clients because it allows the court to take into account abusive behaviors that haven't yet risen to the level of physical or sexual violence—harassment, stalking and abuse through technology (including cyber stalking, threats via text messaging, etc.).

There is currently legislation pending in the Wisconsin State Legislature that would provide for a number of improvements to Wisconsin's restraining order laws in order to make the legal system easier to navigate for victims. One of the provisions addresses the lack of clarification in the current law, which results in some courts denying teen victims of dating violence the opportunity to get a harassment restraining order. This bill, **LRB 2016**, adds clarity so that all courts will hear requests for protection from minors.
